Home Learning

Reading Books:

Please make sure your child reads their school reading book at least 5 times a week for at least 15 minutes. In addition, children could read a book from home, a library book, a comic book whatever will support their love of reading. We would love to hear about any extra reading your child has enjoyed. Some children in Y2 may have a phonically decodable Little Wandle Book which they will receive after their reading practice group. They will keep this book for a week. Some children will receive a book from the school scheme which will be changed once it has been read. Even if your child seems to be a fluent reader, please support your child by sharing or discussing their book with them. Please sign your child's reading record to show that they have read-children will receive prizes in school for regular home reading.

Project Books:

Please support your child to complete activities linked to their current learning in their project book. Listed inside, there will be lots of ideas for ways that your child can showcase their extra learning. Please send Projects back into school on the last Friday of each half term. We will then celebrate their incredible efforts in a special assembly.

Additional ways to support your child's learning: Phonics packs: Children will bring home key words and tricky words to Practise reading at home.

National Curriculum core subjects.

English: This half term to inspire our writing, we will be reading Anansi the Spider and visiting Knowsley Safari Park.

We will learn to:

- Make predictions about a text.
- Sequence events to create a coherent narrative.
- Use verbs in sentence writing and adding adverbs.
- Use adjectives in a noun phrase.
- Use hot seating to explore a character.
- Plan a narrative and a recount.
- Retell a narrative using our own imagination.
- Sequence the events of a school visit and retell it in a recount.

Maths: Addition & Subtraction and Shape

We will be learning to:

- Add three 1-digit numbers.
- Subtract from and across a 10 using a number line.
- Find 10 more or 10 less than a 2-digit number.
- Add two 2-digit numbers (not across and across a 10).
- Subtract two 2-digit numbers (across and not across a 10).
- Answer word problems.
- Compare number sentences.
- Solve missing number problems.

Shape

This half term we will be learning to:

- Identify 2D and 3D shapes and describe some of their properties.
- Describe the similarities and differences of 2D and 3D shapes.

Money

This half term we will be learning to:

- Know the value of different coins.
- Know how to use different coins to make the same amount.

Music: Chime bars.

Geography: Contrasting Location outside the UK. • The 7 continents of the world are: Asia: Africa:

- The 7 continents of the world are: Asia; Africa; Australasia (Oceania) Antarctica; Europe; North America and South America
- Kenya is a country in Africa. Nanyuki is a town in Kenya.
- Walkden and Nanyuki are both towns with: shops; houses; offices; factories
- Seasons are different in Walkden and Nanyuki.
- Nanyuki is near to the equator.
- Nanyuki is hotter and drier than Walkden

PE: Handball

Children will know:

- How to perform a simple chest and bounce pass.
- The importance of keeping their eyes on the ball when catching.
- How to move into a space after catching the ball and how to apply all the taught skills to a simple game of handball.

RE: Who is a Muslim and what do they believe?

- Ramadan is one of the holiest months of the year, where Muslims fast during the daylight hours.
- Id-ul-Fitr is the Festival of breaking the fast which marks the end of Ramadan.
